TAMALES 101

La Tamalada, the holiday tradition of tamale making that's celebrated throughout Texas, is a Latin American custom dating back thousands of years. At San Antonio's Witte Museum, you can learn about the origins and traditions of tamales, get a hands-on lesson, and make your own tamales at a *La Tamalada* class from 11 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. on December 11. Participants will be provided with two recipes and ingredients to create a dozen tamales, as well as their own tamale pot and seasonings to take home so they can host their own *Tamalada*. Central to the tradition is family togetherness. "One of the best parts of making tamales is the *chisme*, the gossip," says Joshua Segovia, special programs and gallery theater manager at the Witte. "If you haven't seen your family in a little while, the *Tamalada* is a perfect time to catch up on all the family drama.
